

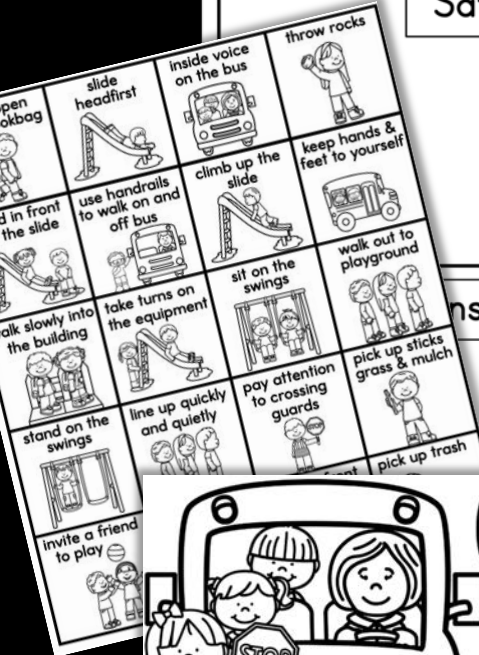

## Bus Safety

If you ride the bus, use the hand walk on and off. Always remember seated, use and inside voice, keep your hands and feet to yourself and keep your bookbag closed. This will help you stay safe on the bus.

Everyone comes to school in a different way. Some children ride a bike, some walk, some are dropped off



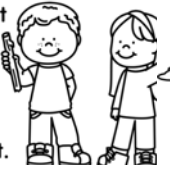
## Crossing Guards

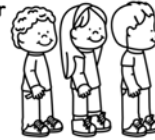
## Recess Don'ts

## Slide Safety

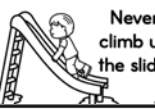
Only one person on a slide at a time.

# Time for School

Now that we are back in school, it is time to review some school safety routines. If we know how to be safe at school, we can learn and grow every day.



# Hallway Safety

It is important to ALWAYS walk inside the building, so you don't get hurt or hurt someone else. Always stay with your class and teacher, never wander off. It is important that your teacher always knows where you are.



# Hallway Safety

Don't talk in the hallway because other students are trying to learn. When students hear noise in the hallway, they pay attention to the noise and not the learning. It can be very distracting.



# Staying Safe at Lunch

During lunch make sure to eat your own food. Don't talk while you are chewing, so you don't choke. When you are done, throw away any trash and make sure your space looks like it did when you got to lunch.



# Spreading Germs

In order to stay healthy, we need to make sure not to spread germs. Use a tissue or your sleeve when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue away when you're done. Always use soap and wash your hands for at least 20 seconds at a time.



# School Supplies

Keep your classroom safe by making sure your space is picked up and organized. If you see a supply on the floor, pick it up so no one trips. When walking with scissors or a pencil, make sure the sharp side is pointing down.



# Adults in the Building

There are many adults in the building who want to help. Your teacher is always there to help you and keep you safe. Review all the other adults in the building who are there to keep you safe too.



# Be a Good Listener

The best way to stay safe at school is to be a good listener. Your teacher and principal will tell you many things each day that will help you grow and learn. Make sure to listen and follow the rules.

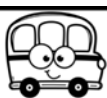
