Poor Recess Choices

- Hide in a spot so your teacher can't see you.
- Push your friend down the slide.
- Throw the ball when your friend looks away.
- Stand on the swings while you're swinging.
- Grab your friend while playing tag.
- Climb up the slide while others go down.
- Stay away from classroom windows.
- Make up rules that hurt you when playing games.
- Tackle your friends when playing football.
- Tell your friends they aren't allowed to play.
- Run back to the classroom.
- When the whistle blows keep playing your game.
- Tap your friend hard so they know they are out.

Good Recess Choices

- Take turns and share the playground equipment.
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- If you see someone sitting alone, ask them to play.
- Use your words with your friends.
- Always make sure you can see your teacher and they can see you.
- When the whistle blows, stop playing and line up.
- Let your teacher know if you see something harmful on the playground.
- Walk quietly back to the classroom in a nice line.
- Only go down on the slide one at a time.
- Tell your teacher if someone is hurt.
- Include anyone that wants to play with you.
